ZERO TRAFFIC POLICY

The journey to and from school should be a happy and safe experience for the students, parents and all the stakeholders linked thereof!

Shishuvan initiated the zero-traffic campaign to create a noise and pollution free environment for the residents around and also for all stakeholders at school. To strengthen the process further, the Bus Committee has set certain guidelines to be followed by the parents and students.

All students are expected to use the bus service authorized by the school on a daily basis to and from the school. The School does not run or operate the bus service but acts as a facilitator and further by authorization only ensures that the norms set by the RTO / Government for running bus services are fulfilled by the bus operator.

Only those children who walk to school, use public transport, or reside in areas where the school bus service is unavailable at present may be exempted. If the parent wishes to propose a change, a letter addressing the Principal mentioning the reason for change has to be submitted.

The zero traffic policy does not permit the children to enter the by lanes of the school in private vehicles. This applies to Shraddhanand Road, Shraddhanand Cross road, Dr. Sulbha Bhattavadekar Marg, Ganpati Mandir lane (P.V. Parmeshvaram Marg), Oza road and K.A. Subramanium Road. If there are traffic or parking violations, after two warnings, a show cause notice will be issued by the Bus Committee. Thereafter strict action will be taken.

No child will be permitted to travel at any time by a route other than that specified on his/her ID. Requests for future changes of bus routes, due to change of residence, should be sent in writing to the Bus Committee. These will be processed according to the availability of seats, on the route required.

Parents and students should disperse immediately and are not allowed to stand outside the gates as it causes inconvenience to the neighbors and the movement of traffic.

The blue lanyards indicate walking students and green lanyards for the identity cards indicate students travelling by school bus.

Request for change in mode of transport on a particular day, should be sent by a written note in the child's diary. Any verbal request to the school/ bus staff will not be considered.

The school should be informed whether the student can be dropped at the destination without an escort or with an escort. In case the parent is not coming for pickup, the parent should send a note informing the name of the person along with his photograph who is authorized to pick up the child.

The parent undertakes that is child will be using / availing the above Bus Service solely at is risk and responsibility. The parent agrees to indemnify and keep indemnified the School and its Management against any claim or demands in respect of use of Bus Service by his Child. The parent will not hold the School / Management liable or accountable or responsible nor make any demand or claim or adopt any proceedings against the School or its Management in case of any accident / mishap or untoward incident or any damage or loss being suffered or occasioned to his child by reason of the use of Bus Service.

The above guidelines have been formulated by the Bus Committee keeping in mind the norms stipulated by the RTO/ Government & to ensure better movement of the traffic in the vicinity of the School , reduce traffic

congestion, noise, pollution and also safety and security of the students. All the parents, students, staff and other stakeholders are expected to adhere to the school rules and transport policy at all times. The parents are also expected to furnish correct information to the school/ Bus Committee regarding the mode of transport used by the student.
